Promotional activities with regard to the Tripartite Declaration of Principles concerning Multinational Enterprises and Social Policy, including in the context of relevant developments outside the ILO

Statement delivered by Mr. Muhammad Abdullah, Permanent Mission of Pakistan to the UN, Geneva

(7 March 2024)

Honorable Chairperson,

We appreciate the update provided by the Office regarding the promotional activities related to the Tripartite Declaration of Principles concerning Multinational Enterprises and Social Policy. We view the MNE Declaration as a valuable tool for fostering excellent industrial relations, given its numerous strengths that contribute significantly to the promotion of decent work and social progress.

This declaration offers invaluable guidance to multinational enterprises, governments, and labor organizations on essential areas such as employment, training, working conditions, and industrial relations, all grounded in international labor standards.

Pakistan is among the eleven ILO member states that have designated a national focal point for promoting the MNE declaration in the country. The Employers Federation of Pakistan currently serves as the national focal point.

The Government of Pakistan has taken significant strides in institutionalizing the principles outlined in the Multinational Enterprises (MNE) Declaration. One notable effort is the establishment of the Inter-ministerial Committee

on Just Transitions, tasked with developing sector-wide action plans. This initiative

underscores Pakistan's commitment to integrating just transitions for sustainable and

responsible enterprises into its core policies.

Moreover, Pakistan's adoption of a National Action Plan on Business and

Human Rights, supported by the International Labour Organization (ILO) and the

United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), underscores its dedication to

aligning national strategies with international standards.

The recent formation of the Business Task Force on the United Nations

Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework (UNSDCF) further strengthens the

connection between the MNE focal point within the Employers Federation of Pakistan

and UN agencies. This collaborative effort ensures a comprehensive and cross-cutting

approach to implementing the MNE Declaration across various sectors and initiatives.

These initiatives reflect Pakistan's proactive stance in promoting

responsible business practices and fostering sustainable development in partnership with

international entities.

We support the draft decision mentioned in paragraph 41 of the document

and are flexible with regards to workers and employers amendments.
