ASPAG takes note of different proposals on the table with regard to procedure of appointment of members of CEACR.We look forward to constructive deliberations on this important subject and consensus approach.

In ASPAG's view, the GBdeliberations should be guided by two-fold objectives:

- 1. Maintainingindependence, neutrality, objectivity and competence of Experts as well as credibility and transparency of process.
- 2. Enhancing efficiency and effectiveness of the work of CEACR.

ASPAG believes that these principles and objectives should guide the decision of the GB on this subject.
